**ORDINANCE NO. 05152024B**

AN ORDINANCE TO CREATE  
SECTION 7-2-19 OF THE TOWN OF BURKE CODE OF ORDINANCES  
REGARDING RETAIL PROVISIONAL LICENSE AND FEE  
IN THE TOWN OF BURKE, DANE COUNTY, WISCONSIN

The Town Board of Supervisors of the Town of Burke, Dane County, Wisconsin, does hereby ordain as follows:

**SECTION 1:** Section 7-2-19 of the General Code of Ordinances, is hereby created to provide as follows:

**SEC. 7-2-19 RETAIL PROVISIONAL LICENSE AND FEE;**


- (a) **Fee.** The annual fee for a retail provisional license shall be set by the Town Board.
- (b) **Provisional Retail License.** The Town Clerk may issue provisional retail license in accordance with Sec. 125.185, Wis. Stats. The provisional retail license shall expire sixty (60) days after its issuance or when the Class "A", Class "B", "Class A", "Class B" or "Class C" license is issued to the holder, whichever is sooner. The Town Clerk may revoke the license if it is discovered that the holder of the license made a false statement on the application.
- (c) A provisional license may not be issued to any retail establishment that has been denied a retail license by the Town Board or who has had a retail license revoked or suspended within the preceding twelve (12) months. The Town Clerk shall provide an appropriate application form to be completed in full by the applicant.

**SECTION 2:** *Effective Date.* This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.

**SECTION 3** *Severability and Conflict.* If any section or part of this Ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

The above and foregoing ordinance was duly adopted at a regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Burke on May 15, 2024 by a vote of 5 ayes, 0 nays, and 0 not voting.
